By the Telecommunications Access Policy Division, Wireline Competition Bureau:

1. The Telecommunications Access Policy Division has before it a Request for Review filed by Deer Park Community Consolidated Elementary School District No. 82 (Deer Park), Ottawa, Illinois, seeking review of a decision of the Schools and Libraries Division (SLD) of the Universal Service Administrative Company. SLD returned, without consideration, Deer Park's Funding Year 4 application for discounted services under the schools and libraries universal service support mechanism because it omitted certain information required under SLD's minimum processing standards. For the reasons discussed below, we deny the Request for Review.

2. Under the schools and libraries universal service support mechanism, eligible schools, libraries, and consortia that include eligible schools and libraries, may apply for discounts for eligible telecommunications services, Internet access, and internal connections.

The Commission's rules require that the applicant make a bona fide request for services by filing with the Administrator an FCC Form 470,⁴ which is posted to the Administrator's website for all potential competing service providers to review.⁵ After the FCC Form 470 is posted, the applicant must wait at least 28 days before entering an agreement for services and submitting an FCC Form 471, which requests support for eligible services.⁶ SLD reviews the FCC Forms 471 that it receives and issues funding commitment decisions in accordance with the Commission's rules.

3. The Commission's rules allow the Administrator to implement an internal filing period ("filing window") for the FCC Form 471 applications that treats all schools and libraries filing within that period as if their applications were simultaneously received.⁷ Applications that are received outside this filing window are subject to separate funding priorities under the Commission's rules.⁸ It is to all applicants' advantage, therefore, to ensure that the Administrator receives their applications prior to the close of the filing window. In Funding Year 4, the filing window closed on January 18, 2000.⁹

4. To further facilitate the efficient review of the thousands of applications requesting funding, every funding year, SLD establishes and notifies applicants of a "minimum processing standard."¹⁰ In Funding Year 4, the minimum processing standards required applicants to submit all the information required in Block 1, the Billed Entity Information section of the form.¹¹ When an applicant submits an FCC Form 471 that fails the minimum processing standards, SLD automatically returns the application to the applicant without considering the application for discounts under the program.¹² While an applicant may submit a corrected

application to SLD where it has omitted information required by the minimum processing standards, the postmark date of that corrected form will be the filing date of the application for the purpose of the filing window deadline.¹³ Thus, where a minimum processing standard correction is submitted after the close of the filing window, the FCC Form 471 is not entitled to in-window priority and will generally be ineligible for funding in years where demand is greater than the available funds as was the case in Funding Year 4.¹⁴

5. In the instant case, Deer Park's Funding Year 4 application was rejected by SLD for failing minimum processing standards because, in Block 1, Item 4a, Deer Park left blank the Billed Entity's Street Address, P.O. Box or Route Number.¹⁵ Deer Park appealed to SLD, requesting that SLD accept a correction and process the application.¹⁶ On June 15, 2001, SLD denied the appeal, finding that the application was properly rejected under minimum processing standards and that the correction could not be accepted because the Funding Year 4 filing window had closed.¹⁷ Deer Park then submitted the pending Request for Review.

6. In its Request for Review, Deer Park again asserts that SLD should have processed its application.¹⁸ However, the Commission has previously affirmed SLD's authority to implement minimum processing standards and to reject those applications that fail to meet those standards.¹⁹ Upon review of the record, we find that Deer Park did not satisfy minimum processing standards in Funding Year 4, because the Street Address, P.O. Box or Route Number in Block 1, Item 4a was left blank.²⁰ Therefore, we must affirm SLD's decision and deny the Request for Review.
