On July 14, 2003, Core Communications, Inc. (Core Communications) filed a petition for forbearance, pursuant to section 10 of the Telecommunications Act of 1996, 47 U.S.C. § 160, requesting the Commission to “forbear from applying the provisions of the *ISP Remand Order*¹ to the exchange of ISP-bound traffic between telecommunications carriers.”²

Comments and oppositions may be filed no later than **August 29, 2003**. Reply comments may be filed no later than **September 19, 2003**. All such filings should refer to **WC Docket No. 03-171**. Submissions may be filed using the Commission’s Electronic Comment Filing System (“ECFS”) or by filing paper copies. Comments filed through the ECFS can be sent as an electronic file via the Internet to: <http://www.fcc.gov/e-file/ecfs.html>. In completing the transmittal screen, commenters should include their full name, Postal Service mailing address, and the docket number of this proceeding. Only one copy of an electronic submission must be filed. Parties may also submit an electronic comment by Internet e-mail. To get filing instructions for e-mail comments, commenters should send an e-mail to ecfs@fcc.gov, and should include the following words in the body of the message, “get form <your e-mail address>.” A sample form and directions will be sent in reply.
