Dear Gentlemen:

Adelpia Cable Partners, L.P. and Key Biscayne Cablevision, each doing business as Adelpia Cable Communications ("Adelpia"), filed a petition for a determination of effective competition in three Florida communities, one of which was the Village of Key Biscayne, Florida ("Key Biscayne"). No opposition to the petition was filed. The Commission granted Adelpia's petition on February 10, 2003. Key Biscayne filed a motion for reconsideration on March 14, 2003. Adelpia subsequently filed a letter request on March 28, 2003, in response to Key Biscayne's motion for reconsideration, requesting that the Commission vacate the portion of the order related to Key Biscayne without prejudice.

Pursuant to Adelpia's request, the Commission will grant its motion to vacate the portion of the order relating to Key Biscayne without prejudice. The Commission will also reinstate Key Biscayne's certification to regulate basic cable service. Finally, Key Biscayne's petition for reconsideration is dismissed as moot.
