FCC WIRELINE COMPETITION BUREAU ANNOUNCES PERSONNEL ACTION

Gregory M. Cooke to Serve as a Deputy Chief of the Competition Policy Division

Washington, DC – Today, Dorothy Attwood, Bureau Chief of the Federal Communications Commission's (FCC) Wireline Competition Bureau, made the following personnel announcement.

Greg Cooke has been named Deputy Chief of the Competition Policy Division of the Wireline Competition Bureau. Prior to this new position, Mr. Cooke served as Assistant Chief of the former Common Carrier Bureau's Network Services Division (NSD). He joined NSD in September 1996 as a senior staff attorney, and was team leader on local competition issues handled by NSD. Prior to joining the Network Services Division, Mr. Cooke was a staff attorney in the Legal Branch of the Competitive Pricing Division of the Common Carrier Bureau from May 1995 to October 1996, where he worked on price cap regulation, regulatory reform for small carriers and access charge reform.

Mr. Cooke received his B.F.A. from Boston University in 1974 and his J.D. from Fordham University School of Law in New York City in 1990. He was an associate at the law firm of Willkie Farr & Gallagher (NYC) from 1990 to 1995, where he worked on various litigation and telecommunications matters. Prior to law school, Cooke was a senior account executive with Stone/Hallinan Public Relations Associates in New York City, where he was responsible for various television and arts projects. Mr. Cooke was also a stage manager at the Juilliard School, and appeared on the television series, "Homicide: Life in the Street." Greg lives with his wife and two children in Montgomery County, MD.
